"Would I be welcome at your church?" This was a question I was asked recently in a New Hampshire state prison by a man who trusted Christ during a prison revival in December 2024. I receive this question often, and my response is always the same: ABSOLUTELY!! How can I say this with such confidence? Luke 5:31-32 says, "And Jesus answering said unto them, They that are whole need not a physician; but they that are sick. I came not to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance," Jesus embraced sinners, not approving of their sins but loving them in spite of their sin! He even told His disciples in John 13:35, "By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples, if ye have love one to another." I am so grateful for a Saviour who loves sinners right where they are but doesn't leave them unchanged!

Family: In January, we took our children to one of their Christmas presents. Hannah and I decided to prioritize experience gifts instead of toys that quickly break. We want to create lasting memories. Using two companion passes from Southwest Airlines and hotel points, we flew our family to the Grand Canyon for less than our usual Christmas spending. It was incredible to see Hannah and the kids experience it for the first time. The whirlwind travel was well worth it. February was a quieter month for our family as we prepared for the birth of our fourth child, Matthew Jr. I had to take an emergency trip to GA because my mom, Cynthia Frank, was facing significant health issues, to the extent that we feared she might transition to heaven. Although there have been major changes in our lives (especially hers) as a result,

> thankfully she is doing much better. Thank you to those who were aware of the situation and prayed for her and our family throughout it. Please continue to pray for her and her health.

> > Ministry: In January, we remained actively involved in schools and prisons across New England.

Despite a busier travel schedule with trips to Arizona and Florida, I managed to keep my prison commitments as

planned. We successfully conducted our second annual prison revival at a men's facility in New Hampshire, during which one man came to faith in Christ. Our pastor, Bro. Chamberland and I have the privilege of preaching two Wednesdays each month at this facility, along with hosting a yearly prison revival every January. A special thank you goes to the Granite State Baptist Church for providing refreshments for the inmates and to Cornerstone Baptist Church in Goffstown, NH, for funding the meals for all the volunteers who came to assist. February was somewhat slower for my family but not for me. I left NH on Saturday, February 1, 2025, traveling to Cleveland, TN, for our annual Ministers Practical Training at the Rock of Ages Ministries home office. After presenting the ministry at a Maryland church on Sunday morning and updating and preaching at one of our supporting churches in Virginia Sunday night, I arrived in Cleveland, TN, in time for the Monday night service. During my stay, I presented the ministry at a new church in Chatsworth, GA, near my hometown. I also participated in special Thursday services at a supporting church in Tunnel Hill, GA. Afterward, I drove to Baltimore, MD, to pick up my family, and we attended a missions conference in Maryland, followed by another service in Pennsylvania on our way home that Sunday night. We returned home just after 7 inches of snow fell, resuming my regular schedule with school on Tuesday. Thank you for your prayers for my meeting with a promising facility in Maine this week. It has great potential for expanding our prison ministry there. Although the facility canceled the meeting that day, we have a tentative reschedule for April. I am scheduling meetings for the upcoming months, and I would love to set up an in-person update with your church! Just reach out to me through email or text. Your prayers and financial support genuinely mean a lot to our ministry and are essential for our success. We are so grateful for your generosity, and we look forward to staying connected as we continue our service in New England!
