Greetings in the lovely name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ! We are happy and excited to report many of the great things the Lord is doing here for and through our family.

In May, I was honored to travel down to the capital city of Port Moresby to preach the charge for the graduating class of Bible Baptist Institute of Port Moresby. Although the entire family was unable to go, it was a great weekend as I was blessed to fellowship with our dear friends and longtime missionaries in Papua New Guinea, John and Lena Allen.

In July, Pastor Camillus Kumbi and I were asked to preach a 3-day meeting in Wabag, Enga, one of our neighboring provinces. This meeting was hosted by Wabag Independent Baptist church, but many other preachers and churches were also in attendance from all over the region. **The Lord moved in a wonderful way, and we came back home rejoicing having seen the revival that had begun in the lives and hearts of these brethren.** Since then, we have stayed in contact to discuss future meetings and ministries, and they have continued to give us reports of the work the Lord is continuing to do in that place.

Once we returned home, we set up the tent in the community of Glanga, Western Highlands. Pastor Camillus and I preached a 4-day meeting there to assist the work of one of our preachers who has been laboring to establish Pilgrim Baptist Church. **During this meeting, 6 souls called on the Lord to save them!! On the last day of the meeting, we were blessed to baptize 19 folks who have been saved in that community in recent days!!** This community is close enough to our new work in Kelua that our entire church was able to attend the meeting each night.

Highlands Baptist Bible Institute: Our Bible school continues to go well as we prepare to start our second semester of classes for this year on August 3rd. **Our spring semester ended well with 4 of our students finishing their final semester of studies and looking forward to their graduation in December.** We are also thankful for a few more students who will begin their studies with HBBI this semester.

We currently have about 45 students enrolled with us at various stages of their studies, so we ask that you please pray for the Lord to work in the ministries and lives of these men and women as they labor in these classes and the Scriptures. This semester, I will be teaching classes on *The Local Church*, *Hermeneutics*, *Soteriology* (Doctrine of Salvation), and 2 *Thessalonians*.

Open Bible Baptist Church, Kelua: The work in Kelua is also going great as we continue to see souls saved and many believers growing in their newfound faith in Christ. **On June 21st, we were blessed to hold our second baptism service where 8 of our people who have called on the Lord to saved them and have been growing in their faith made the decision to publicly follow the Lord in water baptism.**

Each week we continue to see visitors come to our services as the result of the witnesses and invitations of our Christians. It has been amazing to see the Lord work in the hearts and lives of the various people in our community through our various efforts in Kelua. Please pray for our church as many of our folks are facing various trials and troubles from family and friends due to their belief in Christ, yet strive to stand strong in their walk with the Lord.

Open Bible Radio: One of more recent efforts to spread the Word of God throughout our area and the country has been our new weekly broadcast, Open Bible Radio. The local Christian radio station in our town needs solid Bible preaching in Tok Pisin, so I began recording a 30-minute broadcast. We have also been sharing this online via different social media platforms and have seen quite a bit of interest from all over the country. Please pray for the Lord to use the increase in digital activity in our country to be a means to also spread the gospel and solid Bible studies to those who may not have access to such things in their areas.

Upcoming Events: We have quite a few events coming up this year and we ask that you pray with us as we prepare and plan for these meetings.

In September, we will be heading to Wau, Morebe province (an area about 14 hours away from us) to preach a youth camp for the brethren there. Our family will be going as well as a group of our young people from Open Bible Baptist Church who have been saving their money for this trip. I will be preaching each night and sharing a few of the morning sessions with some of the local preachers there, so please pray for the Lord to work in the hearts of the many teenagers that will be in attendance from all over the country.

We are also preparing for a few tent meetings in our area this year. We plan to finally have a tent meeting in Kelua now that “peace” is finally being facilitated between 2 of the conflicting clans in our community.

Also, around October or November, we will be holding a tent meeting in an area called Koibiga near one of the our more established churches, Exodus Baptist Church.

Lastly, in December, we are also planning to take our tent to a neighboring province of Southern Highlands to hold a 4-to-5-day meeting in an area where another veteran labored for a long time. We plan to have evangelistic services in the evening and have youth services in the morning sessions.

Personal Issues: Finally, we ask your prayers for our family for a few different things.

Please pray for my health. I have dealt with some “gut issues” for years, but this year this sickness has gone to another level and caused quite a bit of inconvenience and discomfort. For the last few months, I have been on a very strict diet and supplements and have noticed some improvements. We are aware that the Lord has control of these things, but we are also mindful of how prayer is so powerful.

Recently, we have been blessed to help one of our young ladies from Kelua, Ruthie. She has a rough history of abandonment and other family issues that brought her to Kelua. She stayed with a few different people, and most of those arrangements have ended poorly. Earlier this year, Ruthie was born again, and was one of those most recently baptized.

Since then, we have been trying to help her, but recently she found herself in a dangerous and desperate living accommodations. We believed the Lord would have us “take her in,” so we secured a place for her to sleep near our home and have been able to help her not only with physical needs, but also with her spiritual needs. **Please pray for our family and Ruthie in this new arrangement.**

Lastly, we thank you all for your prayers and support over these years. We know that it is the Lord that continues to bless and do the work here, but it is through your support, both financially and spiritually, that we can continue in this harvest field. May God bless each and every one of you for “holding the ropes.”
