Dear Prayer Partners,

Gail and I trust this prayer letter finds each of you in the best of health along with the blessings of God. As always, we hope your walk and fellowship with the Lord is sweet. Serving the Lord is priceless.

As we write this letter let, we wish to begin by sharing our gratitude. We never wish to fail in saying thank for your continued prayers and financial support. We deeply appreciate the wonderful opportunity you have given us to serve the Lord.

Since our last prayer letter and in one service I preached with 15 men present. All the men were surprisingly attentive and respectful listening as I challenged them to be receive Christ. Upon giving an invitation, six came forward to receive Christ. I spoke with each man stating, “Have you ever been saved. Each man acknowledged his need to be saved. I opened the Bible and shared with them the plan of salvation and in return, they bowed confessing their sins and receiving Christ.

At a new jail to which Gail and I went for a new revival, we had two saved, one (1) man and one (1) woman. It was a small jail in Iuka, MS with about 75 residents. We were there for three days. Gail and I enjoyed working in the Ladies dorm, with the Chaplain. Afterward the chaplain and I worked the men’s dorm. It was a joy to preach in the dorms. Each day they gathered around, turned the TV off and just listened. Some lay in their beds but would raise up and listen as I tried to thunder out what God placed on my heart. It was good to preach were people listened.

We just recently finished the Rock of Ages’ Alabama Blitz. This year there was in attendance of an estimate 75 missionaries and volunteers for the revival. Gail and I worked in the Tutwiler Women’s prison/Annex unit. There were about 250 women residents there. We would enter about the time the women were to have dinner. Placed back in a small office we would begin our service. In a short while and after the chow hall was clean with a thorough mopping we moved our services in there. The first night there were four residents present, the second night 17 and the last night there were 13 present. At the close of the meeting and in our unit there had been nine (9) saved. Altogether, there was 132 saved during the Blitz.
