Dear Financial and Prayer Supporters,

My favorite Bible verse is Proverbs 3:5 and 6. I am still trusting Him to direct my paths. I am currently praying for another lady to come along side me to travel to the Georgia lady's prisons with me. It is not very safe for me to travel alone, and the Bible does say in Ecclesiastes 4:9 "Two are better than one; because they have a good reward for their labor."

In March, I was privileged to be in one lady's prison and in two local jails. Also, in April I went into two local jails. Fulton County jail requires that I attend a training class for admittance into the jail and to continue ministering to the inmates. I was able to renew my badge – Praise God! We had been working on getting a pastor and a few men from that pastor's church to come into this facility with me; however, after a lot of red tape, we have decided not to pursue this. I was praying about this fervently because I cannot go in alone. But just as the Lord always does, He has provided a sweet lady from my church to go in with me. Thank you, Lord.

I have also been praying about getting into another local jail. I was finally invited to go in on April 30th. The chaplain let me give my testimony and through that (as I usually do) I explained clearly the verses that were used to help me receive Jesus as my Saviour. The chaplain would not allow me to give an invitation, which I did not understand. I would have loved to open my Bible to show these ladies from the Word of God how to receive Jesus as their Saviour, but instead I did pray and ask God to work on their hearts and help them understand how to be saved. Hopefully, and prayerfully, they will. I was invited to come back, so I will be going on a monthly basis. I will be doing the service without the chaplain so hopefully I can be a better witness and win some to Jesus.

In May, I was invited to go with a R.O.A. missionary and his wife to a prison in Tennessee. About fifteen women came to the service and while the preacher was preaching, he stopped and asked a couple of the women to please respect him and listen, as they were being very disruptive. Later I found out what the problem was – two inmates had cell phones and were talking on them. It was a tense situation because that is considered contraband. We could have been accused of bringing them in and then given a jumpsuit and ended up in a cell ourselves! Thank you Lord for your protection. We will be going again in June. Please pray that this will not be a problem and that souls will be saved.
