We hope and pray that this finds you all faithful in the service of our great God and Saviour, Jesus Christ. The Lord has surely been good to us here as we continue to labor in this field that is indeed “*white unto harvest.*”

We are so very excited to report that we have been able to purchase our new truck!!

We want to express our most sincere thanks to every one of you who gave to make this purchase to be possible. It was our prayer to be able to gather enough funds to simply purchase a used truck to help us to transport our tent for various evangelistic meetings, as well as pickup/drop off folks for various church services and events.

But after some funds started to come in, I decided to go speak to the manager at the local dealership to find out what the cost would be for a brand-new truck. The manager gave us a very substantial discount once he found out this truck would be used for missionary work. **We are so very thankful that the Lord has provided us this wonderful tool to assist in the work here!!**

Kelua Ministry: The work in Kelua continues to go well as Open Bible Baptist Church continues to grow, both numerically and spiritually. Since our last report, we have seen many folks call on the Lord to be saved. **Over 13 people have come to Christ during our weekly church services.** On Sunday mornings and evenings, I have been preaching through the book of Mark, and on Wednesday evenings we have been studying the book of John. It has been a great blessing to see many of our Christians witness to others in the community and invite friends/family to these studies to learn more of our wonderful Lord and Saviour!!

We have also been enjoying our weekly youth night. Each Friday evening, between 150 and 200 young people come for games, competitions, refreshments, songs, and preaching. Many of our young people have been bringing their friends and classmates each week as we study through the life of David. Many of these young people come from broken homes or horrible backgrounds but unfortunately all that they have been offered by community is sin and more sadness. **Please continue to pray for the young people in Kelua as we work to reach them with the gospel and love of Jesus Christ.**

Also, our weekly Bible classes (CCVE) at the local primary School has been going very well. Quite a few Christians have gotten involved as we minister to 1500+ children and teens every Thursday afternoon. **In the last few weeks, we have been blessed to see 6 teenagers call on the Lord to save them!!** Please continue to pray with us as we use this open door to reach the next generation with the word of God.

Lastly, the progress on our new church building has been going very well!! The foundation for our new building has been put in and the walls are now starting to go up!! It has been a tremendous joy to see our new Christians dedicate their time and money to putting up a permanent church building in this community.

This last week, we also broke ground on a Sunday School house. We had originally planned to wait until our church building was finished to begin this project, but we have blessed with many families who have smaller children and it seems like a proper time to provide a venue where they can also learn the Scriptures!!
